## Burglaries

## Theft

Levels of theft in Calmore remain at far lower levels than this time last year. Sadly, we are coming across the same offenders committing petty theft, mainly against retail premises such as Tesco. These shops have good CCTV and local officers are normally able to identify, arrest and prosecute those shoplifting from the stores.

## Rowdy Behaviour

There were more reports of anti-social behaviour this month which, with the combination of both Halloween and bonfire night, is not surprising. We are seeing a slight trend in youths causing nuisances in public areas around the newer estate including Amey Gardens and Jessica Crescent. We will be talking with youths in the area and taking robust action with anyone found causing problems. At a minimum, children will be returned home and their parents spoken to.

We are conducting regular high-visibility patrols of hotspots, both by foot and on cycles. Alcohol seizures from groups of youths in public areas continue to take place but at far lower levels than in previous years - the message does seem to be getting across.

We are also working with local licensed premises to control alcohol-related nuisance. All pubs in Totton are now part of the Pub Watch scheme and eight people, who cause regular problems at their licensed premises, have now been banned.
